YOUTHCAN IMPACT TEAM HOLDS OFFICIAL LAUNCH EVENT

Dr. Peter Szatmari and the YouthCAN IM-PACT research team held a project launch event on June 14, 2016 at East Metro Youth Services in Scarborough, Ontario. This exciting event attracted 18 partners representing government, not-for-profit organizations, mental health services agencies and family health teams for youth as either participants or supporters of the initiative. The YouthCAN IMPACT project seeks to evaluate the effectiveness of an Integrated Collaborative Care Team (ICCT) model of care including enhanced walk-in mental health services for youth aged 11 to 25, right in the community. The unique features of this project include the integration of existing youth mental health and addiction services and the involvement of patients in the codevelopment of the project and its evaluation tool.

OSSU PERFORMANCE 2016

As part of OSSU's annual performance reporting to CIHR, a number of major contributions to patient-oriented research in Ontario were identified. These include the production of over 1000 knowledge products (including around 300 plain language, media and social media products); over 500 requests for support



(including from patients themselves) - more than half completed within the year; and nearly 2000 people trained through OSSU Capacity building opportunities (see figure), with around 10% of those being patients.

Since the launch of OSSU, patient oriented research has gained a lot of traction in the mainstream of health research in Ontario. It is fantastic to see researchers engaging patients, policy makers and providers in the process of producing contextually-relevant evidence to inform health care delivery.
